



Discover the Icons Walk and re-live some of the memories of the ‘best Games ever’. Using this map you can walk to each red marker on the route and discover the amazing facts behind Sydney Olympic Park’s many cultural, entertainment and sporting attractions.

1.2km Icons Walk – 10 Stops

- 1 ▶ The Arrival**
Your starting point to discovering the many dimensions of the Park.
- 2 ▶ Thin Blue Line**
The Thin Blue Line marks the route of the Marathon, and the exact measured distance of 42.2km.
- 3 ▶ Games Memories**
480 Poles—including 50 interactive poles—which capture many of the memories of the Sydney 2000 Olympic and Paralympic Games, using informative graphics and interactive media.
- 4 ▶ The Stadium**
Hard to believe what was once an industrial site is now a world-class venue and home to the biggest and best in sport and entertainment.
- 5 ▶ Catherine (Cathy) Freeman’s Stride**
Follow Catherine Freeman’s gold-winning 400m run. Each light in the pavement measures Catherine’s extraordinary stride to Olympic victory.
- 6 ▶ The Olympic Cauldron at Sydney Olympic Park**
Nameplates of all Sydney 2000 Olympic and Paralympic Games medallists surround this dramatic centrepiece for the Olympic flame.
- 7 ▶ The Landscape**
Once an industrial site, the landscape is the result of one of the most extensive remediation projects in Australian history.
- 8 ▶ The Showground**
The Sydney Royal Easter Show. The agricultural show that’s so much more - an annual mix of competitions, entertainment, and celebration of Aussie rural life.
- 9 ▶ Abattoir Precinct**
Designed in 1910, the beautiful gardens enjoyed by the workers still prove to be a tranquil setting for today’s visitors.
- 10 ▶ Aquatic Centre**
The home of Australia’s swimming champions. This state-of-the-art Aquatic Centre provides world-class competition pools and leisure pools.



Further North

Discover the Northern Water Feature, which comprises of a lake, ponds, a park, and in-ground waterfall.



Further South

The Tennis Centre and the Greater Western Sydney Giants’ training facility, including Tom Wills Oval. Plus, the Sports Centre housing 26 indoor sports and the Hall of Champions museum.
